SEEDING

Apple 4SGL readily establishes on loosened bare soil or after verticutting existing turf for renovation and overseeding. For typical new seeding applications, apply at a rate of 5-7 lbs/1,000 sq ft. Periodic reseeding at 3-5 lbs/1,000 sq ft maintains density for visual appearance and durability. For overseeding dormant warm season grasses, a rate of 30-40 lbs/1,000 sq ft is suggested for golf course greens. And 7-10 lbs/1,000 sq ft (300-450 lbs/acre) for tees, fairways and roughs.
